New Gate: As part of our ongoing commitment to improving the safety and security of our students, staff and visitors we have now brought into use our new visitor entrance. This is the new middle gate at the front of school. The new gate will only be used after the start of the school day as it will only be opened at 8.45am.

NEW GATE PROCEDURES:

On arrival at School:

The student entrance gate will be open as at present, with the middle gate closed.

At 8.45am the cycle sheds are locked and the middle gate will be opened.

The student entrance gate will be closed & locked for the remainder of the school day.

During the School day:

Only the middle gate will be open for visitors, students and staff to enter and leave.

At end of the School day:

The cycle shed will be opened as usual.

The student entrance gate will be unlocked and opened for students to exit.

The are no changes to the arrangements for the vehicle only entrance.

No-one should use this gate on foot.
