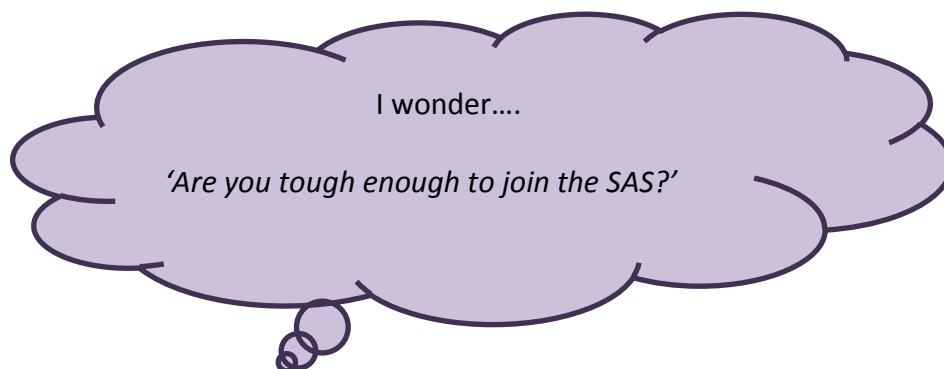
The governing body, with the Headteacher, has overall responsibility for the running of the school. Governing bodies have three core strategic functions:
