

Bournemouth Festival of Literature and Illustration for Children and Young Adults

We would like to invite your pupils to a celebration of children's and young adult fiction. This two day event will take place on Saturday and Sunday, 1st and 2nd July 2017 in the school and grounds of Talbot Heath School, Talbot Woods, Bournemouth. I would be grateful if you could pass this letter to your school librarian and Head of English so that they can bring this festival to the attention of your pupils.

We are designing a bright and lively creative experience for young people of all ages to share their reading experiences, take part in workshops, listen to talks and book readings and, hopefully, be enthused about the reading experience.

To appeal to young adult readers we have an impressive and diverse range of authors and illustrators, people who know how to tell a story and to tell it well. These include Mimi Thebo, whose book 'Dreaming the bear' is shortlisted for the Carnegie Award this year and whose new title 'Coyote Summer' will be published in June. Susan Price, a previous winner of the Carnegie Medal and of the Guardian Fiction Prize with her Sterkarm series, will be running a storytelling workshop. Melinda Salisbury, for those fantasy fans, will be talking about her Sin Eater's Daughter series. Andrew Butcher who writes the Spy High series will be talking about his group of orphaned teenagers fighting a desperate resistance against alien invaders. For graphic novel fans we have Joff Winterhart who wrote and illustrated the funny and perceptive 'Days of the Bagnold Summer', shortlisted for a Costa Award. We also have a talk from Kirsty Stanley who will be talking about the online book community and blogging. In addition, James Cole, Head of Creative writing at AUB will be running writing workshops.

As a special bonus for local schools we are offering the chance for students to win a *free ticket* to the event by reading ten books.
